# NATIONAL ARCHERY IN THE SCHOOL PROGRAM YEARLY UPDATE

The National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) is a joint venture between state departments of Education and Wildlife and several archery equipment manufacturers and organizations. The program promotes student education and participation in the life long sport of Archery. The program's focus is to provide International Style Target Archery training in physical education classes grades 4 - 12

Virginia National Archery in the Schools trainers conducted Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) training workshops on 8/5/2005 (Falls Church), 5/11/2006 (Charlottesville), 5/31/2006 (Roanoke), 8/16/2006 (Newport News), 9/9/2006 (Appomattox) and 10/20/06 (Carroll County). These educators instruct the NASP program to the school students and they can assist the Trainers when conducting a NASP Training workshop. We currently have 92 Educators that have successfully completed BAI training. Each educator receives a certification packet which contains the BAI instruction manual, summary pamphlet, CD which has all the instructions for making the string bow, dominant eye exercise and 11 Steps to Archery Success for the educators to use as they instruct the NASP curriculum to students. The Certification packet also contains a NASP whistle and string for constructing a String Bow.

There are twelve certified Level 2 - Basic Archery Instructor Trainers and five have been actively involved with training this year. There are ten volunteer instructors who have completed the Level 1 \*Basic Archery Instructor training (BAI)

We have 31 schools that have received the NASP equipment sets with the potential of reaching more than 12,890 students this coming year. There are 16 additional schools that have completed the NASP training that are awaiting their NASP equipment sets. The schools are in the Newport News / Portsmouth areas, Lee County, Appomattox, Henry, Carroll, Amherst, Franklin and Bland County. They have the combined potential of

reaching over 9,190 additional students.

Virginia will have 3 NASP training equipment sets: one in HQ- Region 5, one in Region 3 and one in Region 4. We have contracted and purchased the NASP curriculum to be written in correlation with Virginia Standards of Learning to be utilized with Virginia's NASP program. Completed Curriculum will be arriving shortly.

The VA Department of Game & Inland Fisheries has presented NASP at 2 educational conferences in Virginia this year, one in Richmond and one at James Madison University in Harrisonburg in July. NASP has been presented at the educational training for Woods, Wildlife and Water Seminar conducted in partnership with VCU. Presentation was made to the Henry County Board of Supervisors in Collinsville. NASP has been presented at various schools.

We currently have NASP applications

from 42 educators that have expressed interest in obtaining certification so they may offer the archery program in their schools from the following counties: Henry, Culpeper, Amherst, Nelson, Chesterfield, Fauquier, Rockingham, York, Hanover, Stafford, Prince William, Henrico, Goochland, Louisa, Greene, Bedford, Craig, Franklin, Augusta, Shenandoah, Highland and Carroll. We are currently working with schools to schedule and confirm locations for NASP trainings.

The Women's Outdoors event in Henry County, Va. this year ended with a real surprise for Angel Foley. During the fishing event, Angel with no help, cast, hooked, fought and landed (with some assistance) a white Amur (Grass Carp) instead of a blue catfish which had been her intended catch.

Amurs, members of the tarpon family, are very strong fighters when hooked on light tackle so it wasn't unusual that the fish's numerous dashes, and dogged resistance lasted over 40 minutes before it was finally subdued.



The event's host, Reid Young, also pictured with Angel's fish, praised her effort by stating that she didn't make a single mistake during the entire fight. Young said that the fish must have come to the boat 25 times before it was landed. The James River Chapter of Lynchburg recently held its first event, a spring turkey hunt, nine disabled individuals participated, and five were in wheelchairs. Seventeen volunteers were on hand to guide and assist the hunters. This hunt was held on Saturday

morning April 22nd of the 2006 spring turkey season. Hunters and guides met at the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) parking lot at 4:30 AM to pair up and head for their hunting destination. Thunderstorms dominated the morning hunt. No birds were taken but there were a couple misses. The hunt was followed by lunch for the hunters and volunteers at the Forest

Presbyterian Church pavilion. Lunch provided by the James River Chapter. All hunters and volunteers received t-shirts. Door prizes included 6 camouflage jackets donated by Cintas of Bedford and turkey calls from the James River Chapter.

We were able to obtain permission to hunt farms located in the Bedford-Forest area with terrain that could be navigated by an amputee or even someone in a wheel chair. THANKS to all the landowners that let us hunt their farms, without them we would not have been able to conduct a hunt of this magnitude. Farms were scouted beforehand and wooden platforms were set and leveled for those in wheel chairs. Chapter members brought tent blinds to get in out of the rain.

# VIRGINIA WHEELIN' SPORTSMEN CHAPTER HOLDS OUTDOOR DAY III



On Saturday September 3rd, we gathered for the 3rd Annual Outdoor Day of Fun at Shenandoah Stone in Raphine. Over thirty sportsmen with disabilities, and fifty-plus family members and volunteers, enjoyed a full day of trout fishing and the shooting sports. Many new participants joined our team of experienced members this year, and were trying events for the very first time. We have developed some highly competitive, and accurate, shooters in the three years we've been hosting this event. We awarded two first-place plaques for each shooting event: Limited (those with more severe disabilities) and Unlimited (those with full use of upper extremities).

We partnered once again with Parker Bows for our crossbow range. This event continues to be one of our most popular, and our shooters are learning to be very proficient. Jimmy Fulk strutted his stuff as he not only was tops in the Limited class, but also took his two Robin-Hooded arrows back home to Fulk's Run! Glen Smith of Mount Crawford proved to be the best in the Unlimited class. Thanks to Johnny Grace and the entire crew at Parker Bow for their continued support of our program.

Over on the skeet range, first-time participant, Robbie Thomas of Fredericksburg, rolled away with first place in the Unlimited class as he blasted away like an experienced marksman. Bruce Dellinger garnered the first of two plaques, as he swept the Limited compe-

tion. Bruce continued his steady aim at the .22 range taking first place in the Limited class also. McGaheysville's own, Faron Shifflett, cleaned out the 10-ring to win the Unlimited class.

There are some others that need to be recognized for their efforts. Sixteen year-old, Kenny Mays, of Stuart's Draft, impressed everyone with his shooting abilities at all of our events, but especially on the skeet range. Kenny suffers from brittle-bone disease and therefore can't handle the recoil of a shotgun. Rick Laysen and Son Johnston worked hand-in-hand to allow Kenny to blast away at the clay birds. It was rewarding for everyone involved to see Kenny have so much fun.

We only awarded one prize for our trout fishing event, the biggest fish! Fifteen year-old Robert Deel, of Oakwood in southwest Va., took top honors as he pulled in a 13" trout. Robert, injured in a motorcycle crash last spring, was also one of the first to take advantage of the new gun rest we created through our program, "Project Independence". He'll be trying out his new gun rest mounted on his powerchair at one of our eleven fall deer hunts!

Special thanks go out to Game Warden Kris Dougherty of the Va. DGIF; Alan Tiangson and Chris Gayle for an awesome lunch of pork barbeque; our entire team of volunteers that give so generously of their time and resources to help each year; and lastly to the Johnston's of Shenandoah Stone for allowing us the use
